In the same line, we are currently discussing the possibility of the signature of a Memorandum of Understanding with the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology of India. This will help to further strengthen our collaborations and set up an appropriate framework to facilitate the implementation of projects.

Allow me to extend my heartfelt thanks to the High Commissioner of India, Her Excellency Mrs Singla and her Office in Mauritius as well as the Government of India for their continued support in our cooperation programme.
